### Spiritual Reflections

My dear brothers,

We are so blessed to be Catholics!! One of the joys is the season of Lent, which comes from a Middle English word which means "lengthening of days" or "Springtime!" It is a time when we open our hearts to the warm light of Christ, allowing the ice of sin and bad habits melt away, and welcome new growth into our lives. Lent is a time when the hard soil is turned by our fasting, fertilized with acts of charity, watered with our prayers, and seeded with His Word and Sacrament. It is a springtime of renewal and grace!

Lent begins on **Ash Wednesday.** This year it falls on February 14th, Valentine's Day. I would encourage you to speak with your sweetheart and think of an appropriate way to celebrate Valentine's Day while keeping Ash Wednesday first in place. On Tuesday, February 13th, St. Ignatius is hosting a potluck supper, **"Fest Tuesday!"** from 5-9pm. Bring your family and friends! Masses on Ash Wednesday are at 7am, 9am, 11:30am, 4pm, 7pm, and 6pm in Spanish in the Chapel. Please plan your day accordingly!

For all of its focus on repentance, suffering, and death,
Lent points forward to springtime for the soul.

Christ Is for Us

This Lent, **St. Ignatius is increasing Eucharistic Adoration and Confession**. We will offer adoration on Mondays from 9:30am to 7pm, Thursdays from 9:30am to 10:30am, and Fridays from 9:30am to 9pm. Confessions will take place Monday through Saturday after the 9am Mass as well as Friday evenings at 6pm and Saturdays at 3pm. On Monday evenings at 7pm, we will also host a **Lenten Series on the Eucharist** with a guest priest. On Fridays we will offer the **Stations of the Cross** at 9:30am and 6pm. And of course, thanks to you, we will have the delicious **Knights' Lenten Dinners** every Friday from 4-7pm!

The three pillars of Lent are prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. How might you and your family increase the quality of your prayer? Here are some ideas: attend daily Mass, go to confession every month, read the Bible and pray every day. Fasting. What are you going to fast or abstain from this Lent? Try fasting from those things which hinder or block your relationship with God such as excessive or inappropriate media, cursing, gossip, or impatience. Almsgiving. What acts of charity will you share? Helping with the Knights' Lenten Dinners is a great place to start! You may also want to increase your donation to the parish and make a pledge the annual Catholic Ministry Appeal. Lent is only days away. Now is the time to make your plan!

Know that you and your family are in my prayers. May God bless you and your loved ones during this Holy Season of Lent!
