

Spiritual Reflections by Fr. Bill Swengros Chaplain Council #7621

One of the scribes ask Jesus, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: 'Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength.' The second is this: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' There is no other commandment greater than these." Mk 12:28-31

My brothers,

I feel so honored, humbled, and blessed to serve as your chaplain. In my 32 years of priesthood, I have never been able to serve as chaplain of the Knights of Columbus. It is a great honor. As I begin my ministry as your chaplain, I ask for your prayers. You know I need them! I also ask that you reach out to men you know and invite them to become a Knight. I recently learned that my nephew became a Knight. I thank God for the men who reached out to him and encouraged him to join. I know that being a member will be a great blessing to him, his wife, and his children.

A Message from our Field Agent

Dear KofC Family,

Every September a non-profit organization known as Life Happens coordinates the Life Insurance Awareness Month campaign.
